

The CIVA Sanction Fee

Here is some background information to the bureau proposal to raise the CIVA Sanction Fee per competitor from 160€ to 180€. The 160€ level was set in 2014 when plenary last approved a change to this figure.

First - a rough guide to the level of inflation around the world since 2014 -

Based on this guide the world increase in inflation from 2014 to 2020 was 13.96%. The indication from this is that the historic $160 \in$ sanction fee per competitor should now rise from $160 \in$ to $182.34 \in$.

Since 2014 the audited year-end value of CIVA's Reserve has been as follows -

Based on this average of 160 competitors per annum level the return into CIVA Reserves of raising the sanction fee would be -

- + 10€ to 170€ -> 1,600 €
- + 15€ to 175€ -> 2,400 €
- + 20€ to 180€ -> 3,200 €
- + 25€ to 185€ -> 4,000 €
- + 30€ to 190€ -> 4,800 €

The bureau therefore proposes -

- That the CIVA Sanction Fee per competitor is raised from 160€ to 180€ with effect from January 1st 2022.
- That in all bid information currently held and distributed for events planned for 2022 and onwards, the organiser should be entitled to raise the stated entry fees by 20€.
