Main system components:	Numerous Visio 'Stencil' (.vss) and 'Template' (.vst) and 'Add-On' (.exe) executables
Hardware performance specs:	Compatible with Windows systems from prehistoric times, plus Mac systems running virtual Windows apps.
Data:	Creates editable files in native Visio (.vsd) format, plus export to numerous standard graphic formats (pdf, jpg etc).
