- ☑ All other Flight Standards District Office (FSDO) Requirements
- ☑ Compatible aerobatic box location with airport and other traffic
- ☑ Liability insurance requirements
- ☑ Clark County Department of Aviation (CCDoA) approval
- ☑ Las Vegas Terminal Radar Approach Control Facility (TRACON) coordination
- ☑ Box procedures North & South X axis entries; Y axis as well
- ☑ Judging locations East and West side. South unlikely due to prevailing winds.
- ☑ Safe & efficient operations with sky diving jump plane & jumpers
- ☑ Local traffic management
- **☑** Logistics

- Jean Airport 0L7
- Runways
  - 02L-20R 4,600 ft. [1,402m]
  - 02R-20L 3,700 ft. [1,127m]



- Field Altitude 2,835 ft. / 864m MSL
- Box floor & ceiling altitude
  - 3,491 MSL (656 AGL)
  - 6,444 MSL (3,609 AG)
- Will Get Contest Waiver to 6,999 Ft in Class B to accommodate Box Entry.
- Minimal traffic at the airfield will mobilize support for contest








# Highlights



- Competition box is well south of parachute landing zones
- Avoids service road with 500' buffer, small terrain rise (highlighted in red) & prison
- One pilot at a time in the air for 2022 WAAC
- 100% controlled with radio communication
- Competitors in Primary, Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced, and Unlimited
  - No operations below 667 feet AGL in 2022

Departures takeoff and climb to 1200' AGL on runway heading Box exit and descend to 1000' AGL before turning downwind Prison Overflight is Prohibited








#### HARD CEILING - 7,500 MSL in the OUTER CLASS B SHELF

## **Contest Flight Specifics**



- Contestants from Colorado, California, Las Vegas
- All categories of powered & 4 minute free
- Ops Temp was comfortably 6-7 pilots per hour
- Parachute operations impact were negligible
- Excellent support from Las Vegas TRACON
- Hotels walking distance to Terrible's Casino to short drive into South Las Vegas
- Weather was ideal
  - Morning lows 45-50° F/ 8-10°C
  - Afternoon highs `75° F / 24° C
  - Winds were high Thursday good all other days

- Team Tents are 35' x 45' 10.6m x 13.7m
- Easily hold 5 aircraft & tools
- Open structure allows for better ambient cooling
- Team rest and areas and tables
- · Airport will have security during event









### Lessons Learned & Observations



- Contest proved out all necessary facets of contest
- Can easily accomplish 50 pilots in 10 days potentially shorter
- Start early & keep everyone informed Don't assume local organizations share info you have provided. Distribute to all from the organization committee
- Weather temperature and day light were excellent
- Insurance is straight forward budget accordingly
- One sky diving aircraft at the site focused on morning operations.
  - Excellent pilot coordination as well as ground ops
- IAC Chapter 12 box marker visibility in the desert was disappointing
  - CIVA markers are slightly larger will experiment with different color than white
- Worked with TRACON for a 'protected box' up to 7,500 MSL
- Local FSDO was supportive need to modify restriction of on operating at 667 ft. with train under the box
- Judges site will be 'upgraded' for 10 day contest with canopies, portable toilets etc.
